ORGANIST TINA CHRISTIANSEN

Tina Christiansen is a very active concert organist with an extensive international career as a soloist, chamber musician and accompanist. She has played numerous concerts in Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Finland, the Faroe Islands, England, Scotland, France, Germany, Austria, The Netherlands, Italy, Spain, Hungary, Czech Republic, Poland, Latvia and Russia. She has played solo concerts at some of Europe's largest organs in e.g. St Paul's Cathedral and Westminster Abbey in London, Riga Dom in Latvia, Kaliningrad Cathedral in Russia and St Florian Stiftsbasilika (International Bruckner Festival) in Austria. Upcoming engagements include concerts in Poland, Denmark, Norway, The UK and



In 2025, Tina received the Minister of Church Affairs Mette Madsen's Honorary Scholarship.

In 2013, she graduated from the soloist class (the advanced postgraduate diploma) at The Royal Academy of Music in Aarhus (DK) and Malmö Academy of Music (SE). During her studies, Tina received several scholarships and she was a finalist and award winner at several competitions, including 3rd prize at the "4th Feliks Nowowiejski Organ Competition", Poland, and 1st prize at The Royal Academy of Music's Soloist Competition.

Tina has played concerts with several Danish orchestras, she has recorded CDs and she has played the world premieres of music by more than 20 composers from Denmark and abroad.

Tina is the organist and director of music at Ansgar's Church in Odense (DK), and she is the initiator and artistic director of the Odense International Organ Festival.

She teaches at Danish National Academy of Music, MGK Fyn and Løgumkloster Church Music School.

ST KNUD'S CATHEDRAL

St. Canute's Cathedral is one of Denmark's finest Gothic churches, with a history spanning more than 900 years. The first church on this site was built around 1095 and dedicated to King Canute the Holy, who was martyred in Odense in 1086 and later canonized as Saint Canute. Beneath the cathedral lies a crypt containing his relics as well as remains of the earlier church.

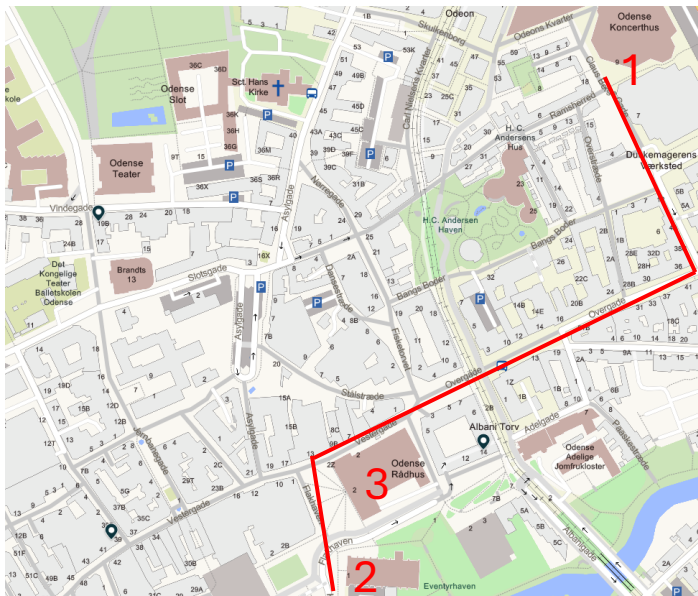
The present cathedral was constructed during the Late Gothic period between the 15th and early 16th centuries. It is renowned for its soaring vaults, beautiful natural light, and the magnificent altarpiece carved by Claus Berg.

Swedish visitors may find it particularly "interesting" that King Christian II of Denmark — known in Sweden as "Christian the Tyrant" because of his responsibility for the Stockholm Bloodbath of 1520, in which nearly 100 Swedish noble persons were executed — is buried in the cathedral.

It may be of interest to note that the Danish fairy tale writer Hans Christian Andersen was confirmed in this church in 1819.

The cathedral's organ, built by Marcussen & Søn in 1862, has been carefully restored and expanded while preserving its distinctive tonal character. Equipped with 57 stops across four manuals and pedal, it remains one of Denmark's most notable cathedral organs.
